

DEAR RIDERS:

I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of some major changes that have occurred within the MSC this past year.

For openers, I took over the position of Chairman of the sports committie . I'm a past Pres. of Walden Playboy M.C. and presently hold the position of Vice President. I've been active in motorcycle racing and promotion of the sport for the last 12 years.

This newsletter is the product of the committies wish to provide the rider with racing results and other activities that occur within the district. Also new this year, the MSC'S membership has been opened to include promoters. New promoters that have joined are Claverack Moto X and Moto X Enterprizes East. Clubs that have rejoined are South woods M.C. and ACE MC., a newly formed motorcycle club, Tri—State M.C. has also joined. All of these combined with Walden Playboy, Cortona, and the Motormiads, are the 8 clubs and promoter that constitutes the MSC. The larger enrollment provides for an expanded and more competitive points event program for the #1 plate and activity awards. We are better able to enforce the rules and regulations of both the AMA and supplemental MSC rules.

As of this date, any new MSC cards mailed to members will be color coded according to age and rider status. Also, a new mini expert class has been formed in order to give more experienced mini riders a goal to shoot for and newer mini riders a more realistic shot at placing near the top.

All in all, the MSC is moving ahead and looking forward to a good finish for this season and a better one next year.

METROPOLITAN SPORTS COMMITTEE

July 20, 1982 meeting, held at Ed's Tavern, Rt. 17K, Newburgh, New York.

Upon receiving the proper protests and complaints, the committee voted to suspend the following riders from participating in District #34 events. The length of their suspension is listed by their name.

#16 - William Watson - mini rider - Bronx. Remainder of 1982 and all of the 1983 season.

#150 - Dennis King - 250 Expert - New Jersey. 30 days, beginning July 25th, ending August 25th, 1982.

#92 - Ricky Erikson - 250 Expert - Conn. Remainder of the 1982 season.

Districts #3 and #6 have been sent notification of their suspensions, and also the A.M.A.

This year District #34 started a new class, The Mini-Expert. To some, this may be a bit confusing, but it really is not.

Points are kept by our Pointskeeper, and when a Jr. Mini rider receives 50 points, he then is advanced to the Senior Mini class regardless of age. When a Senior Mini rider receives his necessary

50 points, he then advances to the new class, Mini Expert. If there are not enough riders (6) to constitute the Expert Mini class, then that rider must ride in the 100 Amateur class. When turning Mini Expert, the rider is not a Motorcycle Expert, such as a 125 Expert, etc. He may want to advance to the 100 or 125 Amateur class, which is okay. The purpose of starting these new classes and advancements was to give the other riders in the class a chance and also to give the winners some new competition. There may also be some confusion, in the color coding of our M.S.C. rider cards. Hopefully the following may help you.

Blue - 6-11 yrs. - Amateur
Red - 12-17 yrs. - Amateur
Yellow - 18+ yrs. - Amateur
Green - 6-15 yrs. - Mini Expert/Motorcycle Amateur
White - any age - Motorcycle Expert

SCORING

How many of you have ever tried to score bikes at a motocross event? Probably not many of you, but for those that have, you well know it is not an easy chore. And that chore gets even more difficult when you don't have the proper numbers on your cycle, helmet and shirt. Remember, white number plates, with black letters, for experts; yellow number plates with black numbers for amateurs. It is a A.M.A. rule you must have both side covers, and front number plate, also 3" numbers on your helmet. When putting them on your helmet, be careful when placing them so that the strap of your goggles, doesn't cover the number. Very often this happens, and sometimes cannot be seen by the scorers. It is not an AMA, or a MSC rule, that you must

have your number on your jersey. But let me say, in the many events I, and others have scored, sometimes your jersey number is all that is visible. If you do put the number on your jersey, please be sure it corresponds with the rest of your numbers. We score a number that we see, and after all, you sure can't get mad at us, if the number you were wearing or had on your cycle, was not correct.

This year you fellows have certainly improved in this category, but some of you are still falling a little short. (If I may, let me congratulate Dennis King, #150, in all the years I've seen Dennis race, this is the first year he's had all of his numbers correctly and the correct number!!! Keep up the good work Dennis, I'm proud of you!)
